BACKGROUND

- Most significant changes were made as a result of the 2012 Provincial Budget.
- The Ministry of Community & Social Services (MCSS) integrated housing & homelessness support programs to better suit peoples' needs.
- First Nations communities were engaged & included in these changes.

SOCIAL ASSISTANCE

Ontario Works (OW): funding is cost-shared with municipalities.

Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP): funding is 100% provincial.

Caseload data:

- As of June 2014 there are 455,908 individuals in receipt of Ontario Works.
- As of June 2014 there are 444,688 individuals in receipt of ODSP.

DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES

- Community inclusion for adults with a developmental disability and their families.
- Community agencies deliver most of the available services and supports.
- Developmental Services Ontario (DSO) is the Service Manager & helps clients connect to services & supports in their communities. There are 9 DSOs across Ontario.

- Waitlists for services.
- Urgent care needs.
- Compliance with requirements for group homes.
- Need for better strategic partnerships.

Successes

- Increased number of granny flats being built.
- Increased units in apartment buildings dedicated to Supportive Living.
- Community inclusion.
