The organization "strives to build global cooperation at the municipal level, promote cultural understanding and stimulate economic development

Sister Cities International's stated goals are to:

- Develop municipal partnerships between U.S. cities, counties, and states and similar jurisdictions in other nations.
- Provide opportunities for city officials and citizens to experience and explore other cultures through long-term community partnerships.
- Create an atmosphere in which economic and community development can be implemented and strengthened.
- Stimulate environments through which communities will creatively learn, work, and solve problems together through reciprocal cultural, educational, municipal, business, professional and technical exchanges and projects.
- Collaborate with organizations in the United States and other countries which share similar goals





Carleton Place is twinned with

- Comrie, Scotland (1992)
- Franklin, TN, USA (2005)





- Comrie relationship was formed in 1992 after suggestion from a Canadian Citizen, originally a Comrie native
- Simultaneous ceremonies were held in both communities to formalize the twinning agreement
- Connection was largely historically based

- Franklin relationship was formed in 1995 after suggestion stemming from a 'Leadership Franklin' class project
- Goal: "form an organization to enhance leadership in citizens who are positioned to make a difference for Franklin."

Sister City Committee

- Twinning Committee formed in 1992
- consisted primarily of interested community members and Mayor of that time
- 2005 staff support and municipal budget of \$2,500
- 2012 no longer required municipal funds

How To Start a Sister City Program

- Find a 'twin' city with similarities (cultural festivals, industry, geographic influences, etc) so that you can learn from each other and share experiences
- Decide what you would like to get out of the partnership/what you would have to offer them
- Have your Mayor reach out to their Mayor with an expression of interest
- Formalize the agreement through Council
- Form a Committee to steer relationship efforts
